

BARNs OF WAYNE COUNTY

Why a Resource Inventory?

Land has qualities that make it suitable for some uses and unsuitable for others. Wayne County Resources Inventory Council (R.I.C.) has inventoried and mapped Wayne County land so that accurate data describing the land can be available for making the best planning decisions possible.

How Can The Inventory Maps Be Used?

TO:

- predict groundwater availability
- locate flood plains
- determine general soil types
- determine general geology
- estimate depth to bedrock
- evaluate underground bedrock surface
- locate special natural features
- locate special historical features
- identify existing land uses
- locate utility lines and conduits
- locate county zoning boundaries
- determine general topography
- locate old dump sites
- teach

Data makes planning possible for the appropriate location of subdivisions, industrial and commercial areas, farmlands, and parks as well as the correct location of utility pathways and surface water drainage ways. Further detailed information is available from Wayne County and city planning departments and the Natural Resources Conservation Service.

Who Needs the Resource Inventory?

- Any person or group interested in present, past or future land uses in Wayne County
- Any person or group interested in changing a land use in Wayne County

RESOURCE MAPS

A CD containing these maps and a narrative description of each map is available in the County Planning Office for \$10.00. Maps are available online at www.co.wayne.in.us/ric.

BASE MAP WITH SECTION LINES –

Shows highways, roads, railroads, streams with permanent flow, cities, towns and villages along with section lines and numbers for location of points.

BEDROCK DEPTH –

Shows depth from land surface to underlying bedrock surface.

BEDROCK ELEVATION –

Shows surface of underlying bedrock using contour lines.

CEMETERIES –

Shows cemeteries in Wayne County by townships.

CONTOURS MAP – 50 FOOT CONTOURS–

Shows general county topography.

FLOOD HAZARD ANALYSIS –

Defines areas subject to flooding in a 100-year flood.

FORMER DUMP SITES –

Shows sites previously used for dumping wastes.

POTENTIALLY SUITABLE LANDFILL SITES –

Shows potentially suitable sites for an environmentally acceptable landfill based on geological and soils data.

GENERAL SOILS MAP –

Shows broad areas that have a distinctive pattern of soils, relief, and drainage and can be used for general planning only.

GEOLOGIC FEATURES –

Shows depth of bedrock, glacial geology, soil types.

HISTORIC SCHOOLS OF WAYNE COUNTY

HISTORIC SITES –

Shows historic sites presently visible.

1874 HISTORY MAP –

Shows turnpikes, railroads, canals, treaty lines, and historic sites based on the 1874 Atlas.

LAND USE – DEVELOPMENT –

Shows placement of all man-made structures.

LAND USE – GROUND COVER -

Shows forests, agricultural areas, quarries, wetlands, orchards.

NATURAL AREAS –

Shows natural areas of special biological, geological and aesthetic interest.

UTILITIES –

Shows underground and overhead utility lines, gas pipes, electric lines, water mains and sewers outside corporation limits, water towers and reservoirs, and communication towers. Telephone lines are not shown.

WATER AVAILABILITY –

Shows general water availability based on well drill data.

WATER RESOURCES –

Shows available water and oil well drill data.

ZONING MAP –

Shows generalized zoning districts in the county. Specific zoning demarcation must be along with the respective county or town agencies. Includes industrial parks.
